A number of check-in sites will provide cold drinks, hot food and fun activities for the whole family.

# Coastal Management Program Grant Deadline is September 21, 2016

Land Commissioner George P. Bush is accepting applications for coastal projects. Up to \$1.8 million in Texas Coastal Management Program grant funding will be awarded. Proposed projects must be located within the Texas coastal zone and address at least one of the following: critical habitat enhancement, coastal hazard response, beach and bay access, waterfront revitalization and ecotourism development, permit streamlining, local planning assistance, or water quality. Applicants must provide a local or third party match to comply with federal matching requirements. Applicants contributing cash must provide a local match of at least 25% of

total project costs. Applicants contributing in-kind services, donations, indirect costs, and/or third party assistance must provide a match of at least 50% of total project costs. The deadline to submit final applications is 5 PM on September 21, 2016. ## Spring Cleanup: By the Numbers

Despite coastal flooding and the cancellation of four sites, 6,757 volunteers braved the weather to participate in Adopt-A-Beach's Annual Spring Cleanup. They removed 110,663 pounds of trash from 27 locations along 151 miles of Texas coastline.

Since 1986, more than 496,000 Adopt-A-Beach volunteers have cleaned more than 9,200 tons of trash from Texas beaches. Cigarette butts, beer cans and plastic bags were among the most common items found. But with each cleanup, plenty of odd and unusual items inevitably are reported. This time, the list of weird stuff found on Texas beaches included: hand

cuffs, a banana magnet, a recliner, a dog house, a tent, and a refrigerator. Adopt-A-Beach volunteers record data on the trash they find to learn more about the causes of marine debris and to help mitigate pollution along Texas' 367 miles of coastline.

The Texas General Land Office Adopt-A-Beach program is an all-volunteer effort to remove trash from Texas' shores. Coastal cleanups are held three times each year and the program's success is due to the hard work of volunteers, including local coordinators who work many unpaid hours publicizing the cleanups in coastal communities. Join us for the Fall Cleanup scheduled for Saturday, September 24th! 🌊

# Teresa So Earns Top Honor in Art Contest

**T**eresa So, a 5th grader from Walker Station Elementary in Sugar Land, Texas, is the grand prize winner of the 2016 Texas General Land Office Adopt-A-Beach Treasures of the Texas Coast Children's Art Contest. Texas Land Commissioner George P. Bush selected Teresa's art from more than 5,000 entries submitted statewide. The annual competition encourages schoolchildren to learn more about the Texas coast and express what they've learned through their art. Open to grades K-6 across Texas, the contest motivates thousands of young artists each year.

"With more than 5,000 entries statewide, the 20th anniversary of the Treasures of the Texas Coast Children's Art Contest has broken all previous records," Bush said. "This contest is a great way for young Texans to learn about the natural beauty of our precious coast and to demonstrate their creativity. Having so many young artists participate this year made the decision especially difficult, but Teresa So's submission stood out due to her attention to artistic detail and careful depiction of the Kemp's ridley sea turtle, one of five of the world's seven sea turtle species known to call the Texas coast home."

Teresa So's artwork, along with 39 runners-up, will appear on the cover of the 2017 Adopt-A-Beach calendar. The artwork of all winners were on public display in the South Central Gallery of the Texas Capitol May 24th – 31st for all visitors to view and appreciate. The exhibit was sponsored by Representative Wayne Faircloth (HD 23, Galveston).

Teresa So's winning artwork earns her two round-trip coach-class tickets from United Airlines to any United destination in the 48 contiguous United States, Alaska, Canada, Mexico and the Caribbean, one 7-night Caribbean cruise from Royal Caribbean International departing out of Galveston, Miami, Ft. Lauderdale, Port Canaveral or Puerto Rico and a class party at Schlitterbahn Waterpark in New Braunfels.

The grand prize winner's teacher, Karen Germany, also receives two round-trip coach-class tickets from United Airlines, and one 7-night Caribbean cruise courtesy of Royal Caribbean International.

Ten winners were chosen from each of four grade-level categories (K – 2nd, 3rd – 4th, 5th and 6th) for a total of 40 winners. All 40 winners will receive a ticket to the Texas State Aquarium in Corpus Christi, a ticket to the Exhibit Hall at the Houston Museum of Natural Science, a ticket to the Houston Zoo, two all-day passes to Schlitterbahn Waterpark in New Braunfels, a certificate of recognition and prizes from the Texas General Land Office and a calendar displaying the winning artwork. 🐢


