D. 1854, by virtue

of the authority in me vested, **Do hereby Certify** that *Gustavus Dreyf & G. F. Kump* appeared before me, and upon oath declared that *before 1st Sept. 1847* *Albert Ahrens &c.* was introduced into TEXAS by virtue of the COLONIZATION CONTRACT of H. F. FISHER & B. MILLER

with the PRESIDENT of the late REPUBLIC OF TEXAS, and that he was *a single man over the age of seventeen years*

when so introduced, and proved the same facts by two disinterested witnesses, to-wit: *the above two on application of A. Dreyf administrator*




