Referring to the above file number covering a claim in your name under the act of February 23, 1900, have to advise that this office cannot accept surveys under the act of February 23, 1900, which would separate surveys of the same system, originally made at the same time and by the same surveyor, and which are united together by common corners. While surveys 3 and 4 H.T. & B.R.R.Co., have perhaps an excess of some 200 varas in E. & W. distance, or possibly this may obtain with surveys 1 and 2 H.T. & B.Ry., yet their calls are such that it was the manifest intention that these surveys should hold together. This is corroborated by their calls and a sketch on the corrected field notes of survey No. 4 patented, (F. 27330) as well as the official map and evidence in this office. Hence, this office will hold that this is an excess rather than a vacancy, and, therefore, your claim numbered as above is hereby rejected for the reasons stated above.

Hence, this office will hold that this is an excess rather than a vacancy, and, therefore, your claim number as above is hereby rejected for the reasons stated above.
