





Referring to the above claim. Your connecting line appears to be clear enough as to everything but the relative position on the ground of the J. P. Harrell survey and the M. B. Terrell survey, which the sketch would show in a general way, but on which particular point the connecting line does not appear to treat specifically. I understand, of course, from your sketch that you would show the East line of the J. P. Harrell to be 283 varas West of the West line of the Wiley Smith, but what evidence have you that leads you to this conclusion? Kindly show by a small supplemental certified sketch, which need not take in any more territory than is really necessary to make same clear of comprehension, and a brief connecting line explanatory thereof, showing just how you found the respective lines of said surveys relatively or 283 varas apart on the ground as you would show them. I suppose that the N.E. and S.E. corners of the Harrell are fixed on the ground and can be found, and that you locate the West line of the Wiley Smith by course and distance from the M. B. Terrell survey, which survey it takes its beginning from. H. & T. C. Ry. survey No. 3 begins primarily on N.E. corner of said Harrell and secondarily recites that this corner is on the West line of said Wiley Smith. Incidentally, I will say, as I did in my letter to Messrs. Tharp & Whitehead, attorneys, that the prospects for this vacancy obtaining on South, from the 2nd N.E. corner of survey No. 2 H. & T. C. Ry. Co. to the reentrant corner of said survey 2, and lying between said survey 2 and Wiley Smith, is precluded in my opinion by the decree of the District Court in suit of Anton Bruner vs. Ezra E. Johnson, with which you are familiar. From the 1st mentioned point on North, as I stated to them, it might obtain, but that it would require evidence to show it. The attorneys, Tharp & Whitehead, in substance say in their letter of the 16th ult., that "at the time you established the second N.E. corner of section 2 H. & T. C. Ry. Co. xx you made what you called corrected field notes of the Wiley Smith, &c. xxx. Now if you have such field notes, this office has not heretofore been advised of same. The patented field notes upon which the Wiley Smith stands are corrected field notes by Will Powars, corrected October, 1861, and recorded in surveyor's record volume E, p. 237. This may account for some of the variance in opinion between this department and the parties.



Replying to yours of the 7th. instant relative to above file No. would say. The East line of the J. P. Harrell Survey is located on the ground as recited in the suit of Anton Brunner Vs Ezra E. Johnson. The South East Corner being 64 Varas South of Halls Bayou. The M. B. Terrell Survey is located on the ground by course and distance from the North West corner of the Harris and Wilson Survey, locating the North West corner of the A. Daley, and as the M. B. Terrell calls for the North East corner of the A. Daley the South West corner of the Terrell is therefore located by course and distance. You will please note that the present location of the Terrell does not correspond with the Bayou calls, giving an excess of distance both North and South of Halls Bayou.

Also note running North from the North East corner of the Terrell the 1403 Varas as originally called for and running West it corresponds with the South line of the Lubbock as now located on the ground, the present Bayou calls coming very close to the original.






