Said land is situated in Harris County about 16 miles north-east from County site and known as Survey No. 19, F. P. B. beginning at the common corner surveys No. 12, 13, 18, and 19, F. P. B.

Thence east along the line dividing surveys No. 18 and 19 F. P. B. 2031.4 varas, a stake on the west line of survey No. 25, F. P. B.

Thence south along the west line of surveys No. 25 and 26 F. P. B. at 801.7 varas the south west corner of survey No. 25 and the north-west corner of survey No. 26, F. P. B. in all 1780 varas, a Stake.

Thence west along the line dividing surveys No. 19 and 20, at 2031.4 varas, a stake the common corner to surveys No. 13, 14, 19 and 20.

Thence north along the east line of survey No. 13, 1780 varas to the place of beginning.
