



SURVEYOR'S STATEMENT IN LOCATING THE A.C. STIMSON VACANCY FILE
AROUND THE WESTERN AND NORTHERN LINES OF THE C.N. PILOT SURVEY
IN HARRIS COUNTY, TEXAS.

The south or southwest corner of the Sarah McFerron Labor is well located and recognized for many years and I began at the "T" rail marking this corner and ran North 58 East at 209 varas crossed creek, in all 1000 vrs. to a concrete monument the southeast or east corner of the Mc Ferron and the south corner of the R.T. Blackburn, thence North 00 deg. 39' West 1705.7 varas to an old axle the Northeast corner of the said Blackburn Survey, Thence along the north line of the Blackburn South 89 deg. 52' West at 889 vrs, pass iron pipe the south east corner of G.C. & S.F.R.R. No. 2, at 4088 a pine knot, at 5150.5 stake and fence corner the Northwest corner of the said Blackburn and the Northeast corner of the Wm. Perkins as the same is recognized on the ground, then from the said pine knot the southeast corner of the J. Lenze survey as it was originally staked, I ran South 89 deg 38' West 2454.8 vrs, to a pipe and fence corner, the southwest corner of the Lenze and the southeast corner of the T.A. Duclos, Thence South 89 deg. 27' West 2556.6 vrs, to an 1 1/2" pipe the south west corner of the Duclose, Thence North 00 deg. 37' West 400 varas to an iron rod in the center of the Boudreaux Road, the north west corner of the Duclos, Thence South 89 deg. 39' West 477.3 varas to Northwest corner of the C.W. Hahl on the East line of the Aug. Senechal.

I returned to the pine knot at 4088 on Blackburn North line and the southeast corner of the J. Lenze Survey and ran North 44 deg. 53' West 566.7 vrs. to iron bar and pipe the recognized south or southwest corner of the Elizabeth Smith League, the southeast corner of the John Mitchell and the northeast corner of the John Lenze Survey, Thence North 45 deg. 50' West 1188.7 varas to a stake the Northeast corner of the said Mitchell and the southeast corner of the C.N. Pilot survey. Thence North 44 deg. 57' West 2548.9 vrs. to an old pipe the recognized Northeast corner of the said Pilot Survey, crossing Willow Creek at 111 varas.

I then with the north line of the Pilot as recognized, fenced and occupied South 89 deg. 31' West 1936.9 varas to an old stake and fence corner the recognized Ell corner of the Pilot and Southwest corner of the Jesse Pruitt. Thence with fence North 00 deg. 36' West 619.6 vrs to an iron pipe and very large pine post in old fence corner, for years recognized as southeast corner of the Lower Wm. Hurd Survey, thence North 00 deg. 31' West along fence and lane 1344.7 varas to iron pipe in center of lane the northeast corner of the said Wm. Hurd survey on south line of Joseph House League, Thence North 89 deg. 29' East 15.8 varas to a "T" rail long recognized as southeast corner of the said Joseph House League. From this "t" rail I ran along south line of the Jos. House survey South 89 deg. 29' West at 1349.3 vrs, pass iron pipe, Northwest corner of the said Hurd and Northeast corner of the J.M. Hooper, at 3270.1 vrs, pass iron bar in road the northwest corner of the said J.M. Hooper and the Northeast corner of the Chauncey Goodrich, as recognized, and at 5191 vrs an old plow point long recognized as the southwest corner of the Jos. House League or making the south line of the House 93 varas excessive over its patent Call.

Returned to "T" Rail at Southeast corner of the House and ran N. 00 deg 52' West along fences and lane 1555.4 varas to south line of the R. Hubbard survey, Thence North 89 deg. 20' East 566 varas to an iron rod and shaft, a recognized southeast corner of the said Hubbard Survey and a corner of the Pruitt. Thence N. 00 deg. 38' West 1903.25 vrs. to northeast corner of the Hubbard and northwest corner of the J.A. Smith on south line of the Joseph Miller League. The call on the East line of the upper Wm. Hurd is 1344 and as it is located to the south line of the Hubbard is 1555.4, the call on the Hubbard east line is 1900 vrs, and measures 1903 1/2 making a total excess between the south line of the House and the south line of the Miller, of 214.6 vrs. more than the sum of their calls. Thence ran South 89 deg. 20' West from N.E. cor. Hubbard to S.W. In staking the Stimson Vacancy the following was the theory used to locate the same. The southeast corner of the Pillot is properly located and recognised on the ground from the first creek crossing on its southline west of the southeast corner and the creek crossing on its east line north of the southeast corner. I have given the Pillot the distance called for on its east line, using the recognised South east corner and the recognised Northeast corner, I have also given the most southern north line of the Pillot as recognised its full distance West, and used the recognised corners on this line, I have then given the upper east line the full distance called for in patent and original field notes, but have ignored its call for the Wm.Hurd corner for its call fails to carry it to the Hurd corner. 

I do not find anything in these papers to show the nature of your application to purchase. 


