

These roads are still on the ground at this date and are recognised as marking the section boundaries. The Gerbigs had already contracted to purchase a part of sections 5 and 6 lying south of the lands they owned in B.B.B & C.R.R. Survey so in grading this particular section road the road was turned on the north line of HC. 

On September 30th this department received from you an application to purchase SF 13422 John Gerbig, 8.5 acres in Harris county, under the provisions of section 6 Chapter 271 general laws, 42nd legislature. This application appears to be satisfactory, but the department is suspending the issuance of awards on all sales made under said Chapter 271 unless the applicant furnishes this department with a statement that it is agreeable to the applicant that the award and patent issue with the following reservation in regard to the minerals: "The minerals in the land are reserved to the State as prescribed by law".

This is due to the fact that the question as to whether or not the minerals are reserved to the State, or the applicant acquires 15/16 of all the minerals, has not as yet been determined. Under a ruling from the former Attorney General (now Governor) this department was advised that the minerals in such sales were reserved to the State and that the purchaser acquired only the rights accorded him under the Relinquishment Act of 1919; in other words, that he could act as agent for the State in leasing the land for oil and gas purposes and in return for such services, share equally with the State in the terms of the lease, provided that in no case shall the State receive less than 1/16 royalty and 10¢ per acre annual rental.

Until the courts pass on the question, or until otherwise advised, I feel compelled to word all awards and patents issued, as above stated.

Upon receipt of your instructions in the matter, I will either issue the award as indicated above, or suspend action on its issuance.


