Save Texas History Essay Contest

ELIGIBILITY:

All public, private and home-schooled students of appropriate age for **fourth and seventh grades** may participate.

GUIDELINES:

The student should address the question, **“What history in your community, or in Texas, is worth saving?”** The student’s name should not appear on any portion of the essay. The submission should be stapled to the **signed** contest entry form. Electronic and paper submissions are acceptable.

QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER WHEN ANSWERING:

- ★ What history is worth saving in your community or in Texas?
- ★ What makes history worth saving?
- ★ Why is it important to save our history?
- ★ How might citizens save their history?

Include authors, publication titles and dates for all sources used. For online sources, list the full URL of each page used.

EVALUATION CRITERIA:

- ★ Creativity: Is the story told in a compelling way? - 40%
- ★ Informative: Are the facts useful and interesting? - 30%
- ★ Grammar / Spelling - 15%
- ★ Organization / Neatness - 15%

4TH GRADE

200-300 Words

Typed or handwritten in essay format

Include original title

Bibliography as separate page required

7TH GRADE

500-800 Words

Typed only, in essay format

Include original title

Bibliography as separate page required

EVALUATION:

Essays will be evaluated by experienced educators and graded based on 4th and 7th grade skill and knowledge levels.

PRIZES:

One grand prize winner from each grade level will receive a complimentary three-day car rental from National Car Rental, as well as several prizes from the San Antonio Tourism Council, including a three-day (two-night stay) in San Antonio, tickets to Six Flags Fiesta Texas, Natural Bridge Caverns, the San Antonio Zoo and other area attractions. Ten finalists from each grade level will receive Save Texas History backpacks, a certificate of appreciation signed by Land Commissioner George P. Bush and a historic map replica from the General Land Office Archives and Records.
