**Eric Quaempts** has been the Natural Resources Director for the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation (CTUIR) since 2004. Before that, much of his career was as a wildlife biologist. Eric combines his education, professional experiences, and personal experiences in the CTUIR community to facilitate management of natural resources in a manner that is responsive to the CTUIR's culture.

In his presentation on *First Foods*, Eric will illustrate the traditional tribal serving order of native wild foods, and demonstrate how the serving order is a responsible and applied basis for managing natural resources for both the tribal community and for Oregonians. His talk will help land management agencies better understand tribal culture and the species and processes they should consider when fulfilling their responsibilities.

**Mark Rasmussen** is a Principal with Mason Bruce & Girard, and manager of its Forest Planning and Economics Group, which consists of economists, appraisers and planners. Mark directs the company's work related to forest economics, forest valuation, forest land management planning, timber and product market analysis, timberland acquisition, and public land management policy. Over the last 15 years, Mark has been involved with long-term planning and/or appraisal on nearly 90 timberland properties totaling more than 40 million acres of private, federal, state and tribal timberlands. He has worked closely with the Oregon Council of Forest Trust Land Counties and the O & C Counties Association on policy issues related to public trust land management.

Mark's presentation will summarize the impact of the Great Recession on timber markets in the west, trends in the recovery of the U.S. housing market, the rise (and fall?) of log exports to China, and the outlook for continued recovery. Recent trends in timberland markets will also be addressed.

## Conference Speakers

**Steve Doherty**, a fourth-generation Montanan, serves as Senior Adviser for the Northwest to Secretary of the Interior Ken Salazar. Steve's territory includes Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Montana and Wyoming. An attorney who worked for two decades in civil and tribal litigation, Steve's responsibilities include interaction with elected officials, legal issues, media developments, and addressing controversial issues within the five states. He served for 12 years in the Montana State Senate, including two terms as minority leader, and for four years as chairman of the Montana Fish, Wildlife and Parks Commission.

Steve's presentation will cover topics of interest to public land managers in the west, as they relate to Department of the Interior policies and current issues. He will discuss the many challenges involved in balancing varied interests in public lands.

**David Ford** is the founder and president of L&C Carbon LLC. He works with forestland owners to expand revenue streams, including selling carbon stored in trees, into voluntary and regulated markets. David is a professional forester with 35 years of experience, and most recently served as executive director of the Oregon Small Woodlands Association. Before that, he founded Metafore, a Portland-based non-profit helping businesspeople evaluate and purchase environmentally preferable forest products. David started his career as a forester with the U.S. Forest Service in California. David also owns and manages a small forest tract in western Oregon.

David's presentation will provide an overview of the evolving voluntary and regulated carbon markets in North America, and will detail the opportunities/barriers and costs/risks regarding public lands participating in these markets.
