About This Guide

The Texas General Land Office (GLO) is working to implement the Tier 1 projects included in the Texas Coastal Resiliency Master Plan (TCRMP) by identifying possible funding sources. The following list of state and federal grant opportunities may be considered by project proponents to fund coastal resiliency projects. The grant opportunities listed below are sorted by eight general categories: conservation, disaster mitigation, restoration, management, research, non-point source pollution reduction, planning support, and non-traditional. Typical project types funded, special requirements, funding details, and application time ranges are shown below by grant opportunity.
