Dear Judge Emmett:

The Texas General Land Office Community Development and Revitalization division (GLO-CDR) has completed its review of all materials submitted to date in support of Harris County's (the County) Method of Distribution (MOD) Amendments No. 1 and 2 for the 2015 Floods and Storms Community Development Block Grant – Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funds. We are happy to inform you that the MOD amendments have been approved.

GLO-CDR approves the County's formula-based allocation of non-housing and housing funds to the identified entities. The terms of the approval are as noted below:

- 1. Acceptance of MOD Amendments No. 1 and 2 does not indicate the eligibility or approval of funding for any proposed projects.
- 2. The County's allocation must meet the requirement that 70 percent of the funds benefit low-to moderate-income persons. Projects that do not meet HUD's national objective for benefitting low-to moderate-income persons may not be approved until the County's allocation requirement is met.

WHEREAS, on June 17, 2016, the State of Texas via Texas General Land Office (GLO) was allocated approximately \$22 million in Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) (Public Law 114-113) funding to be used in the recovery of the four most impacted counties (including Harris County) by Presidential Declared Disasters in May/June 2015 and October 2015; and

WHEREAS, the GLO allocated \$2,756,457 in CDBG-DR to Harris County and required the submission of a county Method of Distribution (MOD) to the GLO; and

WHEREAS, on November 15, 2016, Commissioners Court approved the MOD developed by the Harris County Community Services Department, recommending allocations for housing and non-housing CDBG-DR Funds; and

WHEREAS, On November 16, 2016, the approved MOD was submitted to the GLO and received GLO approval; and

WHEREAS, after approval of the MOD, the City of Deer Park notified Harris County of its decision to decline their allocation of \$243,472.41 in 2015 CDBG-DR funding requiring a reallocation to jurisdictions listed in the MOD, including one to Harris County for an additional \$97,566.37 of CDBG-DR funding, which was allocated to Harris County Precinct Two; and

WHEREAS, to access the non-housing CDBG-DR funding allocated to it, Harris County is seeking approval to submit an amendment to the MOD and a Non-Housing Project Application to GLO detailing Harris County's proposed non-housing projects to repair or mitigate damage that occurred during the Presidentially declared Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) 4223-DR-TX (2015 Memorial Day) and FEMA 4245-DR-TX (2015 Halloween) disasters.

This application is for non-housing projects to repair or mitigate damage that occurred during these storms. The projects include improving drainage of roadside ditches in Precinct 1, street improvements to a neighborhood in Precinct 2, and enhancements to Bear Creek Park's sewer facilities in Precinct 3. Note: This item also includes a change to the previously approved Method of Distribution regarding allocation of CDBG-DR funding to regional jurisdictions.

On June 17, 2016, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under Appropriation Act Public Law No. 114-113, allocated \$22 million in Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) Program funds to the State of Texas to operate the CDBG-DR Program related to relief, long-term recovery, restoration of infrastructure and housing, and economic revitalization in the most impacted and distressed areas (including Harris County) resulting from Presidentially declared Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) 4223-DR-TX (2015 Memorial Day) and FEMA 4245-DR-TX (2015 Halloween) disasters.

On November 15, 2016, Commissioners Court approved the Method of Distribution developed by the Harris County Community Services Department, recommending allocations for housing and non-housing CDBG-DR. The MOD was submitted to the Texas General Land Office on November 16, 2016, and has been approved by the GLO.

Now, to access the funding allocated to Harris County, GLO requires submission of a Non-Housing Project Application detailing Harris County's proposed non-housing projects to repair or mitigate damage that occurred during the Presidentially declared Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) 4223-DR-TX (2015 Memorial Day) and FEMA 4245-DR-TX (2015 Halloween) disasters.

In addition to the non-housing project application, an amendment to the previously approved Method of Distribution is required, as the City of Deer Park has declined their allocation of \$243,472.41 in 2015 CDBG-DR funding requiring a reallocation to the other jurisdictions listed in the MOD as follows:



On June 17, 2016, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under Appropriation Act Public Law No. 114-113, allocated \$22 million in Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) Program funds to the State of Texas to operate the CDBG-DR Program related to relief, long-term recovery, restoration of infrastructure and housing, and economic revitalization in the most impacted and distressed areas (including Harris County) resulting from Presidentially declared Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) 4223-DR-TX (2015 Memorial Day) and FEMA 4245-DR-TX (2015 Halloween) disasters.

On November 15, 2016, Commissioners Court approved the Method of Distribution developed by the Harris County Community Services Department, recommending allocations for housing and non-housing CDBG-DR. The MOD was submitted to the Texas General Land Office (GLO) on November 16, 2016, and was approved by the GLO. An amendment (#1) to the MOD was approved by Commissioners Court on May 9, 2017. The amended MOD was submitted to the GLO and approved.

On August 7, 2017, the State of Texas via the GLO received a second allocation of CDBG-DR funding (Public Law 115-31) of approximately \$11 million to be used in the recovery of the four most impacted counties (including Harris County). A second amendment to the previously approved Method of Distribution is required to incorporate the second allocation to Harris County of \$1,551,438 in 2015 CDBG-DR funding. The funding is distributed for housing buyout (increase of \$496,460) and non-housing (increase of \$1,054,977) for drainage improvements projects under the Harris County Flood Control District from Public Law 115-31 resulting in the attached Table 1: 2015 CDBG-DR Funding and Amendments to the Method of Distribution.

To access the funding allocated to Harris County for housing, GLO requires submission of a Housing Project Application detailing Harris County's proposed housing projects to buyout homes damaged during the Presidentially declared Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) 4223-DR-TX (2015 Memorial Day) and FEMA 4245-DR-TX (2015 Halloween) disasters.

It is recommended that Commissioners Court approve the second amendment to the previously approved Method of Distribution for 2015 Texas Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery Funding and the Harris County Housing Project Application and authorize submittal of both documents to the Texas General Land Office.



WHEREAS, on June 17, 2016, the State of Texas via the Texas General Land Office (GLO) was allocated approximately \$22 million in Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) (Public Law 114-113) funding to be used in the recovery of the four most impacted counties (including Harris County) by Presidential Declared Disasters in May/June 2015 and October 2015; and

WHEREAS, the GLO allocated \$2,756,457 in CDBG-DR to Harris County and required the submission of a county Method of Distribution (MOD) to the GLO; and

WHEREAS, on November 15, 2016, Commissioners Court approved the MOD developed by the Harris County Community Services Department, recommending allocations for housing and non-housing CDBG-DR Funds; and

WHEREAS, On November 16, 2016, the approved MOD was submitted to the GLO and received GLO approval; and

WHEREAS, on May 9, 2017, Commissioners Court approved the first amendment to the MOD; and

WHEREAS, on August 7, 2017, the State of Texas via the GLO received a second allocation of CDBG-DR funding (Public Law 115-31) of approximately \$11 million to be used in the recovery of the four most impacted counties (including Harris County); and

WHEREAS, Harris County's CDBG-DR funding was increased overall by \$1,551,438, increasing the housing allocation to \$1,378,527 buyout activities and Non-Housing allocation to \$2,929,368 with additional funds dedicated to for drainage improvements under the Harris County Flood Control District, for a total allocation of \$4,307,895; and

WHEREAS, Harris County Community Services Department is seeking approval to submit a second amendment to the MOD and a Housing Project Application to GLO detailing Harris County's proposed housing project to buyout homes damaged during the Presidentially declared Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) 4223-DR-TX (2015 Memorial Day) and FEMA 4245-DR-TX (2015 Halloween) disasters.


