Campers will learn what it was like to live in 1830s and 40s Texas.

Additionally, in honor of the 180<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Battle of the Alamo, Mayor Taylor is sponsoring an *Alamo Summer Camp Tuition Scholarship Essay Contest*. Six students will receive full camp tuition to one session of 2016 Alamo Summer Camp (a \$250 value), a certificate from Mayor Ivy R. Taylor and their essay published in the official Alamo Newsletter.

- Contest is open to all San Antonio students between the ages of 9 and 13
