Scores of Cuero residents, 15 years of age and over, have already responded to the offer of free chest X-rays in the campaign to find every unknown case of tuberculosis in this country.

The way the medical director of the campaign, explains it, no one can be sure he does not have tuberculosis. The disease gives no warning when it first strikes.

Yet, the damage inflicted to a person's lungs by TB germs can be revealed while still in an early stage by means of a chest X-ray. The first, miniature films taken among the apparently healthy during our X-ray program constitute a "screening process."

Why We Say-- FLOATING RIBS. Two ribs in the human body are actually floating ribs according to anatomists. The "floaters" are the two lowest ones and not attached to the cartilages of any other ribs. They are more pliable than the others and allow bending movement.

Land Deal Stories Ruled Tops By Columbia U. Jury

Roland Kenneth Towery, young managing editor of the Cuero Daily Record, today, won one of the most coveted awards in American journalism when his stories on the Texas land deal scandal were selected for a Pulitzer prize by trustees of Columbia University in New York City.

The selection was made on the recommendation of an advisory board composed of President Grayson Kirk of Columbia, John Hohenberg, secretary of the University and 12 outstanding representatives of American newspapers and press associations.

Announcement of the award was received by The Record in a direct telephone call from the Columbia Broadcasting System in New York City.

Big Four Envoys Meet To Write Peace Treaty

VIENNA, May 2.—(UP)—Envoys of the United States, Russia, France, Britain and Austria met Monday in an ornate marble ballroom to write an Austria state treaty which could change the cold war map of Europe.

Heavy security precautions curtailed the conference site, the four-power Allied council building overlooking Stalin Square. Some 400 city police and plainclothes detectives were deployed outside the building to hold back crowds and keep newsmen from entering.
